Words that sound the same but have different meanings/spellings

Focus: Adverbs of manner Examples: quickly, lazily, gently, awkwardly

Collective Noun Carnival"

Focus: Nouns that describe a group of people/animals/things Examples: flock, herd,swarm


Conjuction Junction

Steps

- 2. Start with 1-2 titles.
- 3. Try different combinations and orders to create a brief poem.
- 4. Poem should be a minimun of 4-5 lines(books) in length.
- 5. Take a picture and print it on A-4 coloured paper.






